## **Opt-out Form Now Available in the Consent Tool**

CRISP DC users can now complete an **HIE Opt-out form** with their patients through the CRISP DC Consent Tool. This new functionality allows providers to seamlessly conduct a patient opt-out within the HIE.

#### What is an HIE Opt-out form?

The HIE opt-out form allows patients to opt-out of participating in the District of Columbia's statewide Health Information Exchange (HIE). The District of Columbia is an opt-out state, meaning that patients are automatically opted into having their healthcare data shared through the HIE from participating organizations, unless they explicitly opt-out.

Previously only available by going directly to the CRISP DC website, providers can now conveniently launch the form on the website from the Consent Tool.

#### How does it work?

Patients who wish to no longer have their healthcare data shared with other members of their care team, through the DC HIE, should complete this form.

#### How can I access the form?

CRISP DC users can access the opt-out form by searching for the patient who wishes to opt-out, navigating to the Consent Tool in the CRISP InContext App or web-based DC Portal, and selecting the HIE Opt-Out form. Clicking into the form will launch the form in a new window, which can be filled out and submitted via the <u>CRISP DC website</u>.
